We are looking for a few good detectives!! Are you ready for an adventure? The parables of Jesus contain glorious, life-changing truth. But the beauty and worth of God’s truth is hidden from those who have blind eyes and a divided heart. Using hidden treasure as a metaphor for spiritual truth, this study of kingdom parables exalts God alone as the source of spiritual sight and an undivided heart. The goal of our Wednesday night program is to awaken spiritual interest in children, so that they might seek after the hidden treasure of God and find their satisfaction in Him. How? We are creating a mini-VBS on Wednesday nights trying to figure out the mysteries of the parables. There will not only be a Bible Time, but craft time, recreation, and music. What are they learning in Sunday School? Our curriculum in SS seeks to emphasize these five principles:

THE WHOLE COUNSEL OF GOD

The Reformed approach to the Bible sees it as the complete, unified Word of God. Therefore, we examine each part in light of the whole...ultimately to grasp the entirety of God’s revelation to us.

GOD-WARD FOCUS

When we encounter any biblical truth, it teaches us about God as our sovereign Creator/Redeemer/King. And we discover man’s chief end: To glorify God and enjoy him forever!

SHOW ME JESUS™

The unfolding story of salvation is the focal point of Scripture, from Genesis to Revelation. Showing Jesus, who came to seek and save the lost, pervades everything we publish.

COVENANTAL PERSPECTIVE

God’s covenant of grace is a key thread that ties the Bible together. We build on this theme to teach all ages about His constant promise to be our God.

THE HOME LINK

The mission of growing in grace and passing our faith on to the next generation calls for a partnering of church leaders and parents.

Come and Get Your Hands Dirty

Jesus startled His disciples when He took a bowl and a towel, knelt down and washed His disciples’ feet. Jesus put faith into action – He got His hands dirty – literally. This summer we want to give our children this same opportunity – to serve others rather than being served. As Wildwood seeks to become a more missional church, you may be asking, “What is missional?” To be a missional church is to be a church where the members understand that their own neighborhoods are mission fields, that they themselves are missionaries who seek to engage their neighbors in relationships so that in time the Gospel may be presented and received. It is providing to those around us a ‘cup of cold water’ in the name of Jesus. What does all this have to do with Children’s Ministry this summer?

This summer we are inviting you and your children to get your hands dirty in a different kind of dirt – service to our community. For this summer we are dropping some of our regular activities to add service opportunities. Every camp, event, or program

this summer is designed to have the children begin to think beyond themselves and instead of how they as a part of this community can by demonstrating the love of Christ.

How will we do this? Instead of our traditional VBS we will have D.I.R.T. days for children. These days revolve around a service project (see page 3) and end with a fun activity back at the church. For



example, the 4th/5th graders may go to Hawks Rise Elementary School and wash white boards in the morning and have pizza and games in the afternoon. We will also be Diggin’ Deeper on Wednesday nights with a mini-VBS format (Bible Lesson, Games, Snack, and Crafts) around the theme of Mid-Week Mysteries – solving the mystery of the parables. We encourage your children to invite their friends to come out on Wednesday night, and instead of a traditional

VBS craft they will be involved in craft projects that benefit others.

What about Summer Camps? We are continuing a menu of summer camps from cooking to the zoo, but again each camp with have a servant focus. For example, during the sewing camp the campers will not only learn sewing skills, but will make new food bags for Our Father’s Storehouse. In cooking camp they will learn the basics of cooking, but will also make dessert one day for the local homeless shelter. Salt & Light (4th/5th graders) camp will once again go away for a week in August and focus on how we can serve others back in the real world.

Do you have a lot of pre-schoolers in your neighborhood? Then consider hosting a Backyard Bible Club where you reach out and build relationships with the children and parents in your neighborhood.

There are a lot of changes this summer – but again it is an opportunity to begin teaching your children to think beyond themselves and how they can demonstrate the love of Jesus in their community. So come out, join us and get your hands dirty!

All classes will discover what God says in His Word about art and artists, and about the responsibility of the Christian artist in today's world. Art history will be woven into every day, beginning with the most famous and magnificent of all works: God's creation of the world. Students will discover this reflected in the literature of the Bible, in music and in paintings produced through all of history; they will come to understand their own works of art created during the week to also be a reflection of not only God's magnificent creation, but also of the Creator Himself! Students finish the week with a framed piece of their art.
